Richard Seaford. *The Origins of Philosophy in Ancient Greece and Ancient India. A Historical Comparison*. The University Press, Cambridge, 2019 [concentrates on the peculiar ‘coincidence’ of philosophical thought, and ideas of ‘soul’, having arisen in India and Greece at the same time, reaching a crescendo in the sixth century and onward. Offers materialist explanations for these developments. Very interesting, although I find it reductive as a ‘total explanation’].
